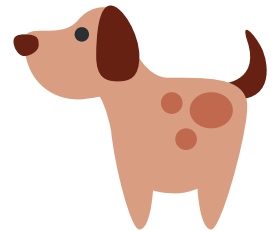


ANSWERS

No matter what type of animal, getting a pet requires commitment and research to know how they should be taken care of. Always speak to experts and seek professional advice before you bring a pet home.

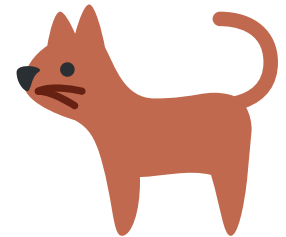
MOSTLY A'S

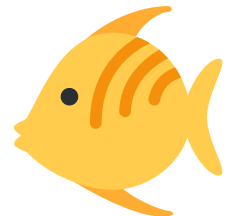
MOSTLY B'S
